PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Hello Everyone

I would like to start this newsletter acknowledging the terrific work of our Aboriginal Engagement Team, particularly our Aboriginal Islander Education Officer (AIEO) Allanna Taranto. Special mention to Ashlee Tucker for all her preparation for NAIDOC.

NAIDOC Week was celebrated slightly differently this year with COVID 19. Not only was it celebrated later in the year, it also saw a few changes to the usual program. However, the week was a huge success with the students learning more deeply the history of Aboriginal people. Other activities included a special dance performance by 'Ngoey Mura Gubal' which means 'we come for all directions of the winds' but our roots are connected to the Torres Strait" History learning of NAIDOC, stories, learning about Indigenous artists, damper making, symbol recognition, textured photo walk, understanding of Acknowledgement to Country and much more.

One tradition we have kept going and will continue to do so is the class door competition. Each year we use the theme of NAIDOC and have classes decorate their door around the theme. The Aboriginal Engagement team select a class to win a prize. The prize is a piece of artwork from Martu Milli. As we have been doing this for several years, we are slowly ensuring each class has some Martu Milli art works displayed. This year Allanna Taranto donated the artwork herself, it was some basket weaving. That was because the class who won this year's door prize added their own weaving to their display.

On Friday 6th November, we had our annual faction Swimming Carnival and Gascoyne were the triumphant winners of 2020. With an outstanding effort by all.

Last Friday, I received the report for our school review. It was an absolute pleasure to read. I feel very privileged to be leading our school and very grateful to be working with such a dedicated staff, great students, and community. The report outlined the six domains each school is measured against. In each area the reviewers only had commendations and no recommendations, which is something quite outstanding. 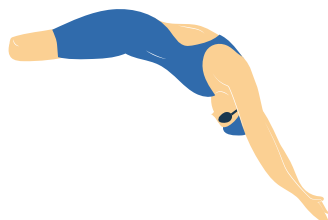

NAIDOC WEEK

9th - 14th November

Always Was, Always Will Be. Recognises that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for over 65,000 years.

We are spiritually and culturally connected to this country.

This country was criss-crossed by generations of brilliant Nations.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people were Australia's first explorers, navigators, engineers, farmers, botanists, scientists, diplomats, astronomers and artists.

Australia has the world's oldest oral stories. The First Peoples engraved the world's first maps, made the earliest paintings of ceremony and invented unique technologies. They built and engineered structures - structures on Earth - predating well-known sites such as the Egyptian Pyramids and Stonehenge.

Their adaptation and intimate knowledge of Country enabled them to endure climate change, catastrophic droughts and rising sea levels.

Always Was, Always Will Be. Acknowledges that hundreds of Nations and their cultures covered this continent. All were managing the land - the biggest estate on earth - to sustainably provide for their future.

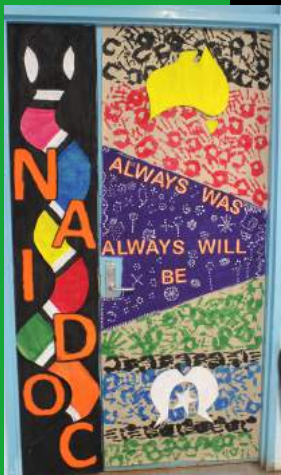
Through ingenious land management systems, like fire stick farming, they transformed the harshest habitable continent into a land of bounty.

NAIDOC Week 2020 acknowledges and celebrates that our nation's story didn't begin with documented European contact whether in 1770 or 1606 - with the arrival of the Dutch on the western coast of the Cape York Peninsula.

The very first footprints on this continent were those belonging to First Nations Peoples. Our coastal Nations watched and interacted with at least 36 contacts made by Europeans prior to 1770. Many of them resulting in the charting of the northern, western and southern coastlines - of our lands and our waters.

For us, the people of Australia, our nation's story began at the dawn of time.
