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Principal's Report

Hello Everyone

Thank you to the students, staff and parents for a fantastic Term One. While its been a busy nine weeks, our school has a great feel and student performance data is showing improvements in all areas. More students are participating in the Accelerated Reader program and doing well, students in MacqLit and MiniLit are passing the levels and we have students reading in Pre-primary.

It has been delightful having our Kindy students at the assemblies. They are sitting quietly through the items and awards and then singing proudly our National Anthem and school song.

This term we farewell Miss Ashlee Outram, one of our Education Assistants. Ashlee is a qualified nurse and was meant to be working in the UK last year when COVID 19 prevented her travel. As a result, Ashlee returned to our school and continued her excellent work supporting teachers and students in a variety of ways from in class support to helping with the carnivals, and our end of year concert. Ashlee's nursing skills have been called upon throughout her time with us to assist with minor injuries and illness. Ashlee has won a nursing position in the South West and will be leaving in the holidays. We wish Ashlee all the very best for her future and sincerely thank her for all the positive ways in which she has added value to our school. Ashlee will be missed.

Recently, we ran a process to permanently employ Education Assistants. I am very pleased to announce that Mr Will Bellis and Mr Callum Henare have been successful. Both gentlemen have been doing a fantastic job working with our students and are great staff members. Congratulations to Will and Callum. One of the roles Mr Will (Bellis) has been tasked with is supporting 12 of our Year 6 boys with the Boys Shed. The Boys Shed initiative was started a few years ago and is going from strength to strength. It is run by volunteers with Mr Chris McIntosh at the helm. The Boys Shed is for our Year 6 male students and provides them with opportunities to learn skills of building and maintaining things around our school using real tools. All safety is adhered to. Through the manual arts and conversation, the boys learn lessons in problem solving and creative thinking with the male role models and staff. If you would like more information about this terrific program, please let me know.

This week we have Kate Williams, Lead Language Teacher from Rossmoyne Senior High School with us. Each week Kate teaches our Year 3-6 students the language of German with the support of Miss Marie. As Kate is based in Perth, the students learn

German lessons delivered by Kate through an Interactive Panel. Miss Marie is in the classroom while Kate delivers the lessons remotely. This week Kate and Miss Marie are working closely with the students doing hands on German activities and assessments. As teaching a second language is mandated this arrangement with Rossmoyne SHS has ensured sustainability and continuity for our Years 3-6 students.

Last week we had the EARBUS launch. This is a program where children are screened for ear health and hearing loss. The launch was to celebrate having the new bus which is a mobile ear health clinic. Audiologists and nurse practitioners are part of the team that services remote and regional WA children and helps detect problem associated with the ears. They can fast track ENT appointments, provide medication and hearing aids to students. This program is funded by BHP and is very valuable in helping children succeed at school by being able to hear. Culturally it ensures stories are not lost as they are passed down the generations. The EARBUS asked all schools in the area to participate in an art competition to decorate the bus. Congratulations to the winners who came from our school, Elsie Cole, Matty-J Ugle and Joshua Olman and a thanks to Miss Marie for organising the art lessons for the competition. More wonderful news for our students is that we have been selected as one of two schools in WA to have an artist in residence program commence in Term Two. Cassia Primary in Hedland and our school have been selected to be part of the fully funded program that will see an artist join us for 12 weeks working with 30 students an art project. The 12 weeks will be spread over Term Two and Three.

We were also successful in having been selected to join the program Olympians Unleashed. This is a program from the Department of Education which will see an Olympian being attached to our school to talk with our students about the challenges and rewards of being an elite athlete. This will complement the great work of Miss Mews our top-class Physical Education teacher.

Congratulations to Miss Mews and the Years 3-6 students on participating in the recent swimming carnival and interschool swimming carnival. Both events went smoothly and were enjoyed by all. We certainly have some excellent swimmers in our school!

It is with pleasure I inform you that Danielle Lockyer has joined our School Board. Danielle has children at South Newman Primary and will be an asset to the Board. Welcome to Danielle.

Next term begins for staff on Monday 19 April. Students return on Tuesday 20 April. I wish students, staff, parents, and carers a lovely Easter and holiday break. Keep safe on the roads.

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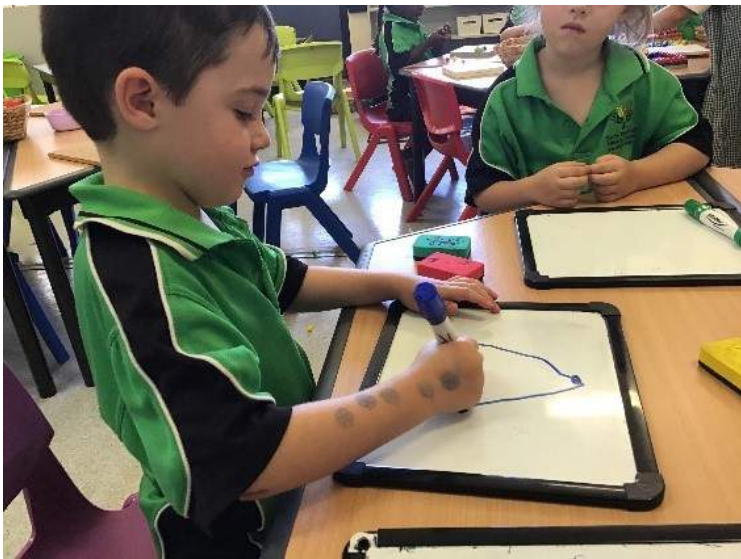
Digital Technologies

This year the students in the Academic Enrichment Program are not only learning about Digital Technologies in specialist lessons, but are also expanding their artistic skillset to the realm of digital art. Over the course of several weeks this term, they have worked on creating a piece of art that uses Artificial Intelligence to combine the art style of famous artists with photographs taken by the students. This involved the students considering the way artists use shape, colour and symbolism to convey mood before exploring a virtual art gallery, selecting an artist and artwork that they found interesting and identifying the mood of the artwork. They then worked with a partner to take photographs around the school that conveyed a similar mood, before finally uploading both the artwork and photograph to an Artificial Intelligence to be combined. The finished artworks look fantastic and it is exciting to see what else the students will create as they continue building upon the skills developed through this project throughout the year.
